TOPIC THREE

Relationship Between Ethics And Morals

The relationship between morals and ethics is fascinating They're often used interchangeably but there are subtle differences.

Consider them like so

Morals: These are your personal beliefs about what's right and wrong unless you question them, They're inherited and deeply rooted in your values upbringing, and experiences; often based on religious or cultural teachings. How individuals. define themselves, and their identity; is manifested in the group's collective

Ethics: These are more formal systems of moral principles that guide behaviour. They're often codified in professional codes of conduct or societal laws. They provide a framework for making decisions that are considered morally sound. it could be "rational" for a self-interested person to be moral,

His or her self-interest is arguably best served in the long run by reciprocating the moral behaviour of others. Regarding values in most ethical systems, both reflect and foster close human relationships and mutual respect and trust

A simple analogy: Imagine you're driving a car. Your morals are like your personal driving style you might be a cautious driver or a more aggressive one. Ethics are like traffic laws. They set the rules of the road and help everyone stay safe.
